In applying the effective interest method, an entity identifies fees that are an integral part of the effective interest rate of a financial instrument. The effective interest rate is the rate that exactly discounts estimated future cash payments or receipts through the expected life of the financial asset or financial liability to the gross carrying amount of the financial asset or financial liability.

ii) Gain from excess interest spread on assignment transactions: Under previous GAAP, since the assignment transaction were carried out at book value of the loan assets with no upfront cash profit/loss, no gain/loss on the said transaction has been recognised on the same. Under Ind AS, gains from excess interest spread is recognised upfront.

(iii) Measurement of financial assets at fair value through Profit or Loss (FVTPL): Under previous GAAP, financial assets were stated at cost. Under Ind AS, if the contractual terms of the financial asset give rise on specified dates to cash flows that are not solely payments of principal and interest on the principal amount outstanding, the entity shall measure the fair value of the financial instrument with changes thereof to the

statement of Profit and Loss.

Similarly, under previous GAAP, non-current investments were stated at cost. Where applicable, provision was made to recognise a decline, other than temporary, in valuation of such investments. Under Ind AS, equity instruments have been classified as Fair Value through Profit or Loss (FVTPL) on the date of transition and changes in fair value after the date of transition has been recognised in profit or loss.
